

## Hobbies Page Hints

In case you are stuck, here are some hints for the hobbies page.

First, open your text editor (Simple Text, TextWrangler, Notepad, Notepad++, etc).

- If you are using Simple Text, you will need to make sure the preferences are set to display HTML code.
- You can get TextWrangler for the Mac at <http://www.barebones.com/products/textwrangler/>

Save the page as hobbies.html

Save your image to your mysite folder. All images and files should be together in one folder. That is why our two web pages and one image we created in class are together in the mysite folder. You will keep adding to this folder so it is important that the folder and all of its contents are on your thumb drive.

When you create pages for this class it is easier to work with the folder on the thumb drive. That way you will not suffer from "which version is the real version" syndrome.
